
This assessment analyzes the performance of officers in the field in light of the Consent Decree's requirements on the use of force. Consequently, the focus is on what officers do and do not do rather than on the quality of the investigation or documentation that reviewers are asked to consider. A separate, forthcoming assessment will consider the quality of reporting, investigation, and review of use of force incidents.


Nevertheless, it may be that a lack of information, an incomplete or deficient investigation, or other problematic documentation or investigative techniques may prevent reviewers from making a definitive conclusion. Where investigative issues or deficiencies prevent a definitive determination in a given area, reviewers should (1) mark "unable to determine," and (2) describe the issue or deficiency that prevents a determination in the free response area at the end of each major assessment area. In many instances, a simple notation of "insufficient evidence in case file" or "investigation incomplete" may be sufficient.


More generally, and especially where responses are "no" or "unable to determine," reviewers <u>must</u> explain, in sufficient detail in the comment box at the conclusion of each section, their findings.

For instance, it is not enough to check the box "unable to determine" next to "analysis of evidence sufficient for purposes of investigation." Reviewers must go on to describe, in the relevant free-response field, precisely why the analysis was not sufficient.

Some basic information about the subject and officers is separately captured by an existing CDP database. Consequently, reviewers are not asked to duplicate some basic demographic information about involved subjects and officers. Reviews can be analyzed by cross-referencing that already-entered database information.


